# **KNOWING the Components & the PROCESS for College Bound Seniors**

- Application Types: Common, Coalition, Direct to Institution (save all passwords)
- Requesting Transcripts
- Self-Reported Grades (SRAR)
- Sending Test Scores—Direct from Testing agencies
- <u>Deadlines</u>—When and Type
- Essay/Personal Statement
- Letters of Recommendation (Completing Senior Questionnaire and resume in Naviance)
- FAFSA—Complete after Oct.1—Take advantage of help
- Scholarship Opportunities/Applications

# **Should Have Done/Be Doing**

- Log into Naviance (program that facilitates much of process)
- Complete Senior Surveys in Naviance
- If Using, Create Common App Account and Match CA to Naviance
- Research Colleges in Naviance and determine where you will apply
- Check Email Regularly
- Check Naviance for scheduled in-person and virtual visits
- If **Athlete**, register with NCAA-- http://www.ncaa.org/student-athletes/future/how-register

#### Naviance

- Complete your SENIOR QUESTIONNAIRE (brag sheet)/Surveys
- Continue to **research** colleges and careers
- Request transcripts
- Request letters of recommendation from teachers
- Register for virtual and in-person college visits "at" Brentsville
- Match your Common App (IF Using)
- Find Scholarships

#### Letters of Recommendation

Ask teachers at least two weeks in advance.

Complete your resume in Naviance.

Do not submit college forms (secondary school reports or teacher rec forms) to us. We use NACAC/CommonApp for all college applications.

#### Admissions Deadlines

**Regular Decision**: Students submit applications by the deadline (usually Jan-Feb) and receive decision in early spring.

Rolling Admission: Colleges decide on applications as they receive them.

**Early Action**: Non-binding; students submit applications early (usually Nov. 1) and receive the decision early (usually Dec. 15).

**Early Decision**: Binding agreement; students agree to attend the college if accepted and withdraw all other college applications.

## Test Optional Schools

- Most colleges and universities have adopted test-optional policies during the pandemic.
- They will accept scores if you have them but won't require them.
- Talk to your counselor if you are concerned about not having a test score.

#### **FAFSA**

#### What is it?

Free Application for Federal Student Aid to determine Financial Aid eligibility

- Do I need to complete it?
  - **YES!**—many states, colleges and private scholarships use FAFSA data to determine awards for other aid/scholarships. *Must be filed every year in college*.
  - You can start filling it out October 1st
- Where can I get help with filing?
  - Attend one of the PWCS FAFSA sessions- (Unity Reed High School October 11<sup>th</sup> 6:30-8:00)

## Four Year College Application Process

- Complete the student/parent sections of the application on-line.
- Request ACT/SAT scores to be sent from the ACT and/or the College Board.
- Request the transcript in Naviance 10 business days before the deadline.
- Request teacher/counselor recommendations if needed.
- Do not submit college forms (secondary school reports) to us. We use the NACAC or Common App form for all applications.
- Submit transcript fees to the Counseling Center; first 3 transcripts are free; \$5 for each additional request.
- Check Naviance to verify that transcripts and secondary school reports have been sent.
- File FAFSA beginning Oct. 1, 2022 (must be done every year)

  - Do you have enough CORE courses?
- Request transcript in Naviance be sent to NCAA
